W. L. CALLAHAN SCHOOL TITLE 1 PARENT AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT POLICY

- This occurs formally in the fall and the winter of the current school year. Parents are invited to participate in this session, which enables them to provide feedback on the Title I program.

Parents are accommodated in this process through before and after school meetings, as well meetings during the school day as requested, and parent surveys and questionnaires.

Parents are involved in an organized, ongoing, and timely way, in the planning, review and improvement of Title I Programs. This takes place through:

- Parent/teacher conferences
- Personal contact by Title 1 teachers
- Title I information on our school website
- W.L. Callahan Showcase of Learning
- Title I Parent Group to address relevant topics for today's families.

Parents of participating children are provided timely information about the Title I Program, as well as a description and explanation of the curriculum in use at the school, forms of academic assessment used to measure student progress, and the proficiency levels students are expected to meet.

- Report Cards

- Parent Teacher Conferences
- Title I Learning Suggestions
